## Where does the food come from?

It comes from people making donations via food drives, monetary donations, and volunteering. Donations are received by food manufacturers, processors, grocery chains, and other food suppliers. Local companies and organizations, as well as members of the community, also play a key role by making monetary and food donations. Food Pantries work to safely provide and ensure that all food is edible and within the expiration date to the best of their ability.
